All: May God help us to have compassion for others as we work towards peace and justice for people everywhere.

1st Reader: As we light the Christ candle, we remember our faith and the gift of hope, which God offers to us in the Christmas story. We remember that Jesus was born to bring us abundant life, forgiveness, and healing. We know that the angles declared peace and joy to all with the birth in Bethlehem. God shares our life, and promises to be with us at all times; good and bad.

All: Let us remember the one who shows the way and who goes with us into our tomorrows.
